

GOD'S UNEXPECTEDD GIFTS

excerpts from the Messenger April 2024 Reflections, by Robyn Reals close friend of Susan Berg, Annette Hanks' sister

Sometimes God takes us by surprise with unexpected zaps of love. Sometimes when we pray for them, sometimes before we even know to ask. The moments can come in small glimpses:

My beautiful grandmother, failing but cozy on her flowered sheets, reportedly saw three people at the end of her in-home hospital bed. A feisty lady, she shooed the unknown visitors away saying she "wasn't ready," and they left. When told perhaps one might have been my grandfather — who passed — she said, "Of course not, I know your grandfather when I see him!" A nice visit, but I guess she wasn't ready. She passed quietly a short while later. God's gift of independence.

Or there was the time my father sat beside my mother on her last days in the hospice facility. On a visit, I noticed that in her direct view hung a bland, brown landscape scene. At least it was something to look at, I thought. One day Dad reported my mom perking up and staring at this nondescript view with a sparkle in her eye. Her head bobbed up and down, and she said, "Yes, yes!" and seemed quite pleased. Dad looked at her, then around the antiseptically decorated room. He saw nothing different, and asked Mom about it. She pointed to the picture and said, with enthusiasm, "Yes, that's beautiful, colorful, I think I could do that!" Dad asked, "What?" Mom pointed to the landscape and told him she could go there: "It looked pretty nice." And so, she did. God's gift of a beautiful future.

And then there was my childhood-long closest friend. She and I spent all our momentous life phases together, from middle school headaches and heartthrobs to college and Brethren Volunteer Service, marriages and moves, to the joys of grandparenting. We had laughed our way through many antique stores over the decades, shared scores of decadent donuts, and completed each other's sentences and bad jokes. Then one day, she was given three to six months to live.

My husband and I visited once a month up to her last few days. Shortly before we arrived, her sister wrote to prepare me emotionally. My friend had slipped into a quiet, sometimes confused, or agitated state. The message was that I might not be noticed, recognized, or heard, but was encouraged and welcome to come.

I had not seen this message before we walked in her door.

My friend had changed dramatically and looked very tired. But we were, as always, so delighted to see each other we dove immediately into non-stop chatting. I privately took sad note of her dramatic decline and immobility. We spent a few hours reminiscing, laughing, and just being quiet with each other. We said what we knew would be our last goodbyes. My friend asked me to lean over her hospital bed railing for a long cheek-to-cheek hug. She said I must shout "Hallelujah!" when Jesus came for her. I promised I would, but honestly did not believe that would be my first outburst.

I approached her blissfully unaware of the caveats, and for nearly three hours we enjoyed a visit that, unbeknownst to me, had been heaven-gifted. I returned home to find her sister had written again. My friend had immediately slipped back to her nonverbal quiet state until the end. She shared some smiles, but no further chats. Family was summoned a day or two after, and Jesus came for her while she was surrounded by love.

I will forever remember the cold January morning I received God's astounding blessing of that window of time. My friend's last moments of lucidity and our opportunities for goodbyes were gifts that humbled me. She traveled this phase of life without me. I will bring the donuts when it is my time. God's gift of time.
